

Food security and safety continues to be a topic of global significance. As competition for resources increases agronomists have a critical role to play in ensuring the profitable and sustainable production of food and feed products.

In New Zealand that includes making the most of new opportunities associated with irrigation. Recent Statistics NZ figures show a substantial rise in the area of land irrigated since 2007 (approximately 102,000 ha) which has unlocked further productivity gains across our primary industries. During this time there has also been a heightened awareness of the potential impacts associated with intensification, especially those relating to nutrient loses and soil degradation.

This year our conference theme is "Sustaining agriculture and horticulture - new science, technologies and practices". We look forward to a range of papers on these topics during our 3-day joint event (November 5-7) with the NZ Grasslands Association.
